**Colwood Explores Sewage Treatment Alternative**

COLWOOD - A trailer parked in Colwood Friday could contain the answer to the Capital Region's sewage headache - at least that's what Boydell Wastewater Technologies believes. "We've developed an electro coagulation system which is treating water using electricity rather than biology" says Vice President Randy Boyle.

Boydell's system on display in Colwood uses electrical current to separate solids from sewage, promises littlefootprint -- and no smell. "We're a totally enclosed vessel. The sewage is never left out in the open" adds Boyle.

Each electro coagulation reactor costs about \$500,000. It would take two of them to treat Colwood's sewage, and likely 100-150 to cover the entire

CRD. Boydell says startup costs for Greater Victoria would work out to a few hundred million - a fraction of the CRD's \$1.2 billion plan being developed. That's got Colwood kicking the tires. "It's like buying a used car, or a motorcycle, or a bike. You don't go to one store and shop there - you go everywhere" says Councilor David Saunders.

The City of Colwood may be keeping neutral on Boydell's offering right now, but Esquimalt - Juan de Fuca Liberal incumbent Keith Martin is not. The opponent of the CRD's \$1.2 billion plan stopped by the demonstration Friday, and left impressed. "It's a stark contrast from the \$1.2 billion boondoggle that's going to add \$700 of property tax to everybody in the community" says Martin.

Martin believes Boydell's system would allow municipalities to opt-out of the CRD's master plan, and pursue more inexpensive treatment on their own. Which Colwood says it's not prepared to do, yet.

The Capital Regional District says it is familiar with Boydell's system, which it calls emerging technology -- and says it would like to see proof it works -- on a much larger scale than Friday's demonstration.
